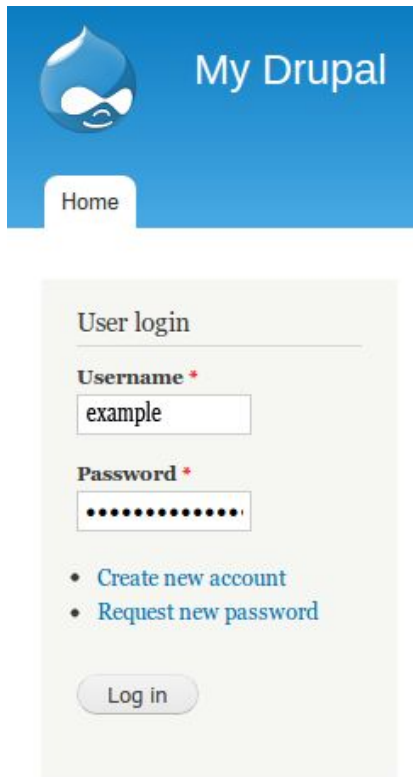


## Drupal Integration Guidelines

### Step 1.

Log in to your Drupal admin panel.



### Step 2.

In the admin panel choose the 'Modules' options located in the upper part of the page.

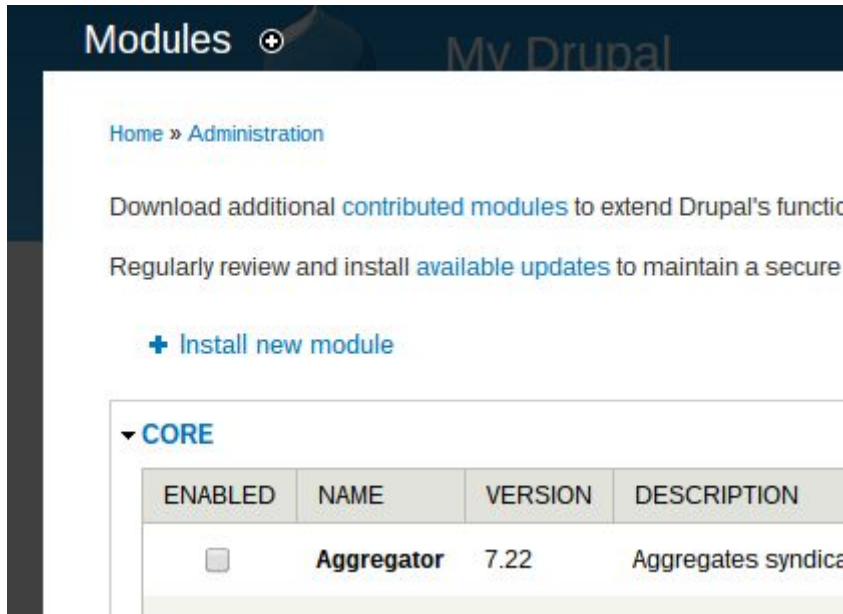


### Step 3.

Download the CDN configuration app in the .zip format using the following [link](#).

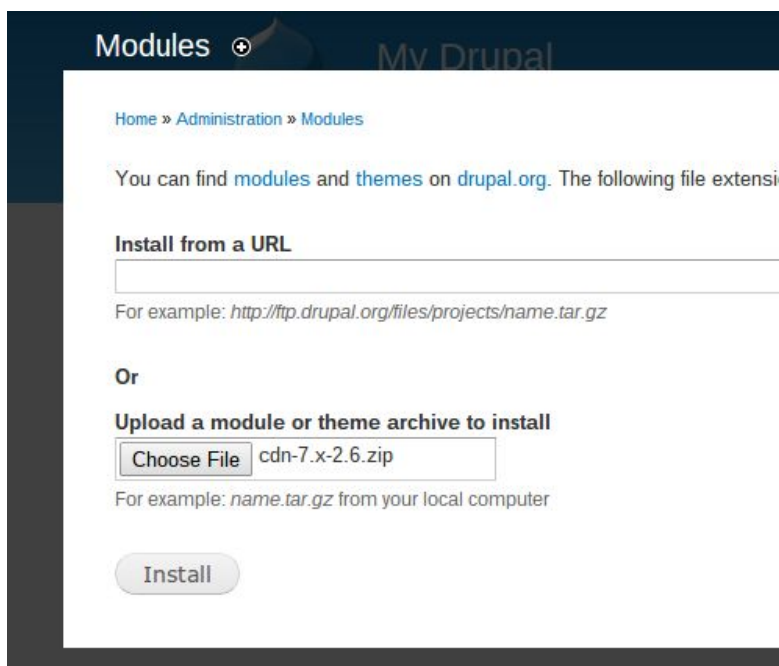
## Step 4.

After the app is downloaded, choose the 'Install new module' option.



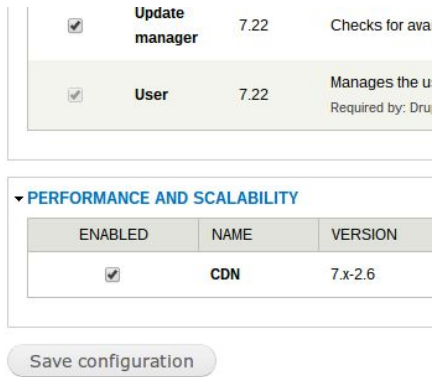
## Step 5.

Click the 'Choose File' button and browse your computer for the CDN app module that you downloaded.



## Step 6.

After the CDN module is installed, go back to the list of modules and scroll it down until you find the CDN one. Check the 'Enable' checkbox and then click the 'Save Configuration' button.



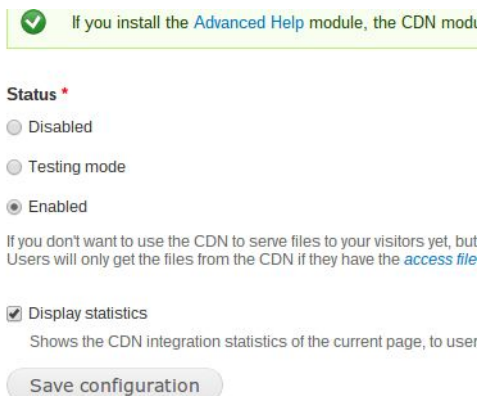
## Step 7.

Choose the 'Configure' option.



## Step 8.

Choose the 'Enabled' status for the CDN module and save your new settings by clicking the 'Save Configuration' button.



## Step 9.

On the right side of the configuration screen click the 'Details' tab.



## Step 10.

Choose the 'Origin Pull' under 'Mode' and then specify your CDNvideo domain name (you can find it in the email message with all settings that you received from our employee).

### Mode \*

- Origin Pull
- File Conveyor

Choose a CDN integration mode.

### MODE-SPECIFIC SETTINGS

#### CDN mapping

example.cdnvideo.com

Define which files are mapped to which CDN.

#### Far Future expiration

Mark all files served from the CDN to expire in the far future — improves client-side  
**Note:** this requires the "Aggregate and compress CSS files" performance setting  
**Note:** only use Far Future expiration when using a CDN or a reverse proxy.

## Step 11.

Scroll down and check the 'Far Future expiration' checkbox, and then save the new configuration.

Far Future expiration  
Mark all files served from the CDN to expire in the far future — improves client cache performance.  
**Note:** this requires the "Aggregate and compress CSS files" performance settings to be enabled.  
**Note:** only use Far Future expiration when using a CDN or a reverse proxy.

**Unique file identifier generation**

sites/\*|mtime  
sites/\*|.avi|.m4v|.mov|.mp4|.wmv|.flv|perpetual

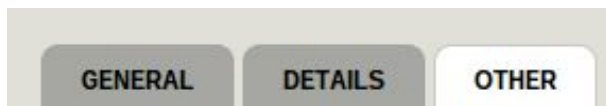
Define how unique file identifiers (UFIs) are generated.

## Step 12 (optional).

Click the 'Other' tab on the right side of CDN module configuration screen.



## Step 13 (optional).

Enable HTTPS for SSL support (this is optional). Before you enable this option, please contact our support team as first we need to enable this option for you on our side.

If you install the [Advanced Help](#) module, the CDN module will be automatically configured.

**HTTPS**

CDN supports HTTPS  
Enable if you use HTTPS and your CDN supports it too.
